Protests Order To Remove 40 From Cottage At Laurelton Village

The president of the board of trustees at Laurelton State Village described an ordered removal of 40 women from an institution cottage as a "drastic" move capable of causing "great disturbance and chaos."

Fred W. Maue said at Shamokin that "this is drastic action and I hate to contemplate the disturbance and chaos which might result from this action."

Welfare Secretary Harry Shapiro ordered removal of 40 mentally defective women from the building as "reminiscent of the dark ages."

"It must be remembered, Maue said in a statement, "that there are some 1,100 girls at this institution and that the secure cottage was built to isolate some 40 of them who became violently disturbed at certain periods."

He said that the women were put in this special cottage at the Union County institution "so that no harm will come to themselves or other girls."

Earlier, Dr. Effic Ireland, superintendent of Laurelton, protested Shapiro's order for removal of the women from the cottage.

Meanwhile, two officials of a fiveman team continued a personal investigation today of the institution. Dr. Hilding A. Bengs, commissioner of mental health, said the group will report its findings to Shapiro.
