Laurelton Center sale approved

HARRISBURG - The agree-

ment of sale has been signed by Gov. Ed Rendell and Gary Murphy, owner of Mountain Valley Inc., Dayton, Maryland, for the former Laurelton Center.

Mr. Murphy paid \$1.63 million for the sale of the property.

Mr. Murphy plans to develop the 366-acre property into a hotel with various recreation and business ventures.

The sales agreement contains a clause which prevents the property from being used as a licensed gambling facility. If Mr. Murphy or a future owner would use the former Laurelton Center complex as a gambling enterprise, the title of the property would revert back to the state.

According to the agreement of sale, the settlement is to occur within 90 days.
